Pilot Identification Card

BFC has begun a new program to aid our dispatchers. All student pilots and rental pilots will be given a Pilot Identification Card that, among other things, will list your qualifications and limitations with respect to renting and operating our aircraft. Your CFI will fill out the card with your individual information and present it to you. The card will be updated any time that your qualifications change (i.e., new license, rating, aircraft checkout, instructor limitations, etc.). If you are not currently taking lessons, the dispatcher will provide you with the card. **PLEASE** keep this card with your license and medical certificate and bring it with you each time you come in for an appointment. We may ask to see it before dispatching your aircraft.

Birds...

Our fellow aviators, the birds, are now out looking for places to nest. They love airplanes. Look for bird droppings or pieces of straw near the nose or tailcone. Look carefully in all intakes and the tailcone of the aircraft during your preflight. If you discover a nest notify a BFC employee right away. The nests are usually very extensive and have to be completely removed. Do not throw the nest on the ground as the birds will pick it up and replace it.

Know Your Limitations...

As a competent pilot, you should know your own your limitations. Never push a situation that you are uncomfortable with. Also, never hesitate to execute a go-around if things just do not seem right. Remember, Fly Safe!
