New England Weather...

As the saying goes, "if you do not like the weather in New England then wait ten minutes." The saying is correct. Recently we have been experiencing a growing number of customers cancelling appointments days in advance as a result of less than ideal weather forecasts. Many times, however, the forecasts were ultimately wrong and those days had turned out to be beautiful for flying. We are urging our customers, therefore, to be patient and wait until the day of the appointment to make their final decision.

Baggage...

The cargo compartments of our Piper Warriors are excellent for storing baggage during flight. There is one fault, however, that the Piper engineers neglected to address: the access panel to the empennage is located in this area and is constructed of a soft material held in place by nothing but Velcro. The problem: loose items could possibly shift into the empennage during flight, interfering with the stabilator, rudder, and stabilator trim flight control cables. Not a good thing! All loose items, no matter how small, should therefore be firmly secured under the cargo straps to prevent shifting. During preflight be sure to check the empennage for foreign objects, and ensure that the access panel is firmly in place.

Ramp Repairs:

The deteriorating portion of our ramp area has finally been repaired. Still be sure during your preflight to check the area surrounding your aircraft for rocks and other foreign object, and dispose of them accordingly. Also be sure to check the propellers carefully for damage.
