## Safety Tips...

Tip #1: If it becomes apparent that you can not touch down on the first one-third of the usable runway, execute a go-around **immediately**. The sooner you begin the execution, the safer the situation will be.

Tip #2: If, when arriving to an airport, the existing crosswind component exceeds that of the aircraft, or you are in doubt as to whether you can operate safely or not in the existing winds, land at another airport. Be proactive, however: whenever in doubt, do not takeoff. Know the aircraft limitations, and your own too!
